FRENCH

Pupil year: Lower 4 (Yr 8)

SUBJECT OVERVIEW

Head of Department: **Mr D O'Neill**

In Lower 4 we provide opportunities for girls to develop and practise the range and complexity of their French enabling them to talk about themselves, their family and friends, town, school and daily routine as well as discovering the French geography and school system.

Subject Topic

- Describing yourself and your relationship with family and friends.
- Describing where you live. Arranging a meeting. Expressing pros and cons of countryside vs town and environment issues.
- Discuss your daily routine, school subjects, school rules and looking at future plans.

- Talking about the weather.
- Leisure and freetime: talking about likes and dislikes.

Grammar

- Prepositions.
- Adjectives.
- Reflexive verbs in the present tense.
- The immediate future tense.

- Develop listening skills to identify key ideas in spoken Spanish.
