Amazing Amelia is nationalist finalist

Enormous congratulations to Amelia Moody (Lower 5) who performed amazingly to finish sixth at her first ever South West Schools' Cross Country Championships in Truro last Saturday.

It was only recently that her enormous talent was unearthed and, without any form of professional coaching, throughout all the qualification runs Amelia has consistently beaten trained club runners with much more experience.

"I felt very nervous on Saturday as the course looked so windy and complex and I knew it would decide whether or not I would go to the Nationals. I live and run on Dartmoor so I'm used to mud, but the mud on Saturday was extra slippery," she said.



"I had been running most evenings after school and it is a bit scary at times as I don't really like the dark so I am looking forward to the lighter evenings! I am very honoured to be going to the Nationals and, for the next five weeks, I'm going to ensure that I put lots of effort in so that I get the best out of the experience."

In coming sixth out of the best 61 runners to have qualified throughout Cornwall, Devon, Somerset, Avon, Wiltshire and Gloucestershire, Amelia has automatically secured her place at the Essa National Championships in Norwich next month.
