## Maddy and Harmony at the Nasa SpaceApps hackathon

Two of our students spent last weekend at the Met Office for the Nasa SpaceApps, an international two-day (29-30 April) hackathon that brings together coders, scientists, designers and technologists and anyone else with an interest in all things to do with space.

Maddy Jago (Year 6) and Harmony Bidder (Lower 6) formed a part of the Space Unicorns team who decided to create a geodesic dome based on the Hawaii Hi-Seas centre. Harmony worked through her idea to create furniture using origami folding and Maddy helped her to develop the idea using fabric for a series of prototypes in a range of materials from recycled fish and chip boxes to shot silk and then a spare duvet cover lined with tape, board and unbelievable amounts of hot glue.

Although they didn't win, the team's brilliant approach to finding materials to experiment with, their determination to develop a fully furnished Space Centre rigorously to scale, plus their really impressive team work throughout was felt worthy of a special mention by the Met Office team running the competition. So a huge well done to all of the team but particularly to the two Maynard representatives, Maddy and Harmony!
