#### Busy week for Drama

It's been a really busy week in the Drama department. On Thursday 12 October, the GCSE and A -level drama students attended Therea Hesketh's brilliant 'Around the World in 80 Days' that is currently on tour at the Northcott Theatre and they were even treated to a special aftershow Q and A session with the cast. The performance was outstanding and

meeting the cast afterwards was a real treat.

Then, on Sunday 15 October, Paolo Guidi of award winning theatre company 'Frantic Assembly' spent a day working with our exam students. He ran two 'Devising and Physicality' workshops; a two hour session for Lower 5 and four hours for Upper 5 and the Sixth Form. The students were stretched and challenged to work with the company's highly physical movement techniques. They created some fantastic sequences using lifts and physical connections and had lots of fun whilst making the most of this excellent opportunity to work with an expert practitioner.





#### **Recruiting all singers!**



The Devon County Junior Choir (DCJC) and Schola Exe are two of the County ensembles which provide extended music making opportunities for children in Devon. These were established by Rachel Smith, our Junior School Director of Music, and she continues to conduct, administrate both and recruit!

DCJC was established 10 years ago as part of the Government Sing Up campaign and over this time it has grown and flourished. It meets on Saturdays in term time in Exeter at 9.15am for two hours and is for

girls and boys in Years 3 - 8; it provides a forum for learning good vocal technique and choral discipline as well as having fun. The music the choir learns and performs is wide ranging and includes lots of individual songs from folk to musical theatre (generally in two or three parts), as well as preparing for involvement in major concerts; its next event is participating in two Carol concerts in the Cathedral with the Exeter Philharmonic Choir in December.

Schola Exe is the senior choir for girls aged 13 - 18 and boys with unchanged voices. This was formed in 2012 as the senior choristers in DCJC were reluctant to leave, so it became a natural extension. The choir sings much more challenging music and is regularly invited to take part in major concerts in the Cathedral; in November it will be performing with the English Touring Opera in Bach's Mass in B minor. Schola Exe also rehearses on Saturdays, from 11.30 - 12.45 and, at present, has a Maynard Sixth Former as one of its members.

Several current and former members of DCJC and Schola Exe have gone on to gain choral scholarships to Oxford and the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, and to join the National Children's Choir of GB and the National Youth Choir of GB.
