Our enormous congratulations to Alex Daniels (Upper 6) who has raised a substantial amount of money for charity following her gruelling 240-kilometre Congo-Nile cycle ride during the October half term.

Earlier this month, Alex handed the RD&E Hospital a cheque for £870.57 to help fund respiratory research in memory of her grandfather who sadly passed away from idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis in 2012.

“The cycle was a chance to raise money for charity, whilst allowing me to conduct research into my study project on ecotourism and its impact on local communities. The Congo-Nile cycle was particularly challenging, riding in the humid environment of Rwanda from early in the morning until noon. Cycling in the 30 degree heat made us prone to heat stroke throughout the day which made it very difficult at times. As Rwanda is named the ‘land of a thousand hills’, we encountered many of these inclines throughout each day, meaning we were exhausted by the evening!”

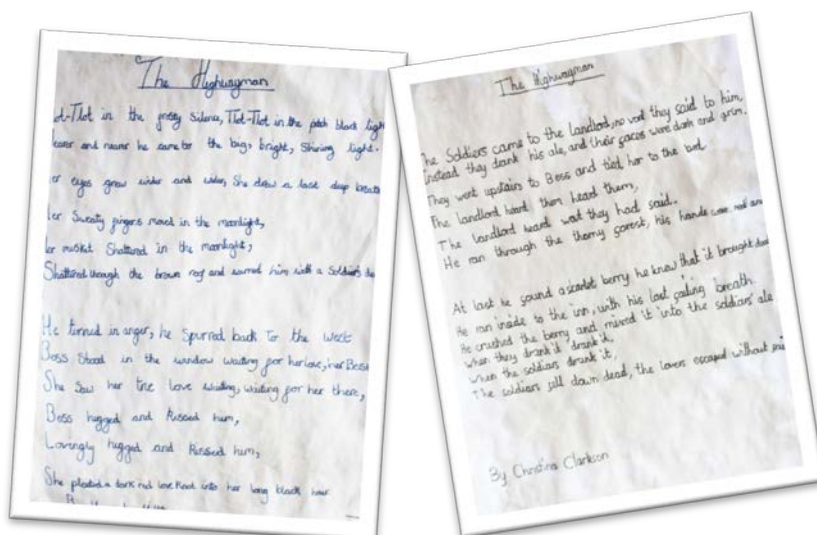

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### Aspirational tales of adventure - not to be missed Geography lecture

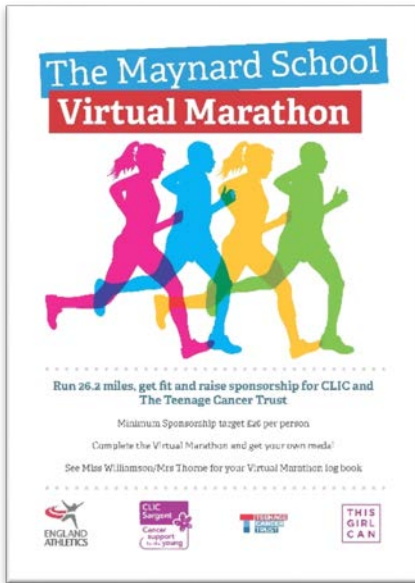
