Charity Mufti Day on Thursday 21 June



May we advise parents and guardians that we will be hosting a charity Senior School Mufti Day on Thursday 21 June as part of an important project being led by one of our Sixth Formers, Miren Sowden. Miren has been championing the cause of a charity called 'Friends of Burburi' and we are thrilled to be able to support her in these worthy endeavours.

This is a local charity that supports a healthcare and maternity clinic in the poor and rural community of Buburi in Western Kenya. The local people there face many serious health issues such as Malaria, HIV and AIDS, Typhoid and many mothers and babies die in childbirth. The charity is run by four women, all nurses, and they fund all the salaries of the health staff, the drugs and the building of new facilities.



In a recent assembly, Miren highlighted the good work that Buburi also does in sending out specially made sanitary pads to girls in this impoverished area, enabling them to attend school where previously they would have to stay at home during this time of the month. History dictates that once girls start having to miss school on such a regular basis, they soon become disillusioned and start to drop out altogether thus continuing the cycle of poverty and making them more vulnerable to child marriage and teenage pregnancy.

On 21 June, Miren is inviting girls from across the Senior School and Sixth Form to join her in the Textiles room to help make as many washable and reuseable pads as possible during the lunchtime break which will, in turn, be sent out to the Burburi schoolgirls to enable them to go to school and not fall behind in their studies. The pads are very easy to make and there is a pattern with easy instructions to follow so do please encourage your daughter to help Miren boost production numbers.

As part of this initiative the Mufti Day will cost £1 per person and all the money raised will go towards the materials required for the pads and the cost of transporting them out to Burburi where they will change the lives of so many young women.

Eco Warriers Clothes Swap returns by popular demand

Also on Thursday 21 June is the hugely popular Clothes Swap, organised by our very own Eco Warriers Club. The inaugural event last year proved so popular that they are hosting this one by popular demand so do encourage your daughters to have a spring clean of their wardrobes and bring in any unwanted clothing.
