# Upper 3 Wellbeing Information Evening



The Maynard hosted its first Wellbeing Information Evening this week with really positive feedback from the Upper 3 parents. As one attendee stated, "It was a great evening and I think you are doing wonderful things with the girls."

The evening informed parents of the new Upper 3 PSHE tutor programme which incorporates the 'Living Life to the Full for Young People' - an evidence based

CBT (cognitive behaviour therapy) course designed by Professor Chris Williams from the University of Glasgow. Using simple, accessible language and lots of practical strategies it equips the girls with the life skills to enable them to deal with every day stresses and worries, with the aim to develop their confidence and resilience.

Although we have only just begun the programme, we feel it has the potential to have a huge impact on the girls as they go through the school and we aim to roll out the programme to other year groups in due course.

Dick has previously visited the school to talk to students and staff and, such was the impact of his truly memorable talks, we have invited him back by popular demand. Who claimed that adolescence is just a phase? Who suggested that being a parent is easy? Dick Moore, the parent of four often errant children and a headmaster for almost 23 years, embarked upon a mission to discover more about what makes young people tick and what he could or should have done during the challenging times! He has a passion for the mental and emotional health and wellbeing of young people and will be exploring how young people think, why adolescence is an especially vulnerable time and about common issues which can arise when the going gets tough. Finally, he will offer some tongue-in-cheek tips for parenthood.....

Dick has spoken at over 350 schools, universities, businesses and conferences both in the UK and overseas. He is an instructor for Mental Health First Aid, a trainer for the Charlie Waller Memorial Trust and has attended an ASIST course in suicide intervention. He gave a TEDx talk in April 2015 and a Head Talk in 2018. He has also appeared on BBC Breakfast, BBC Radio 5 Live, various local BBC radio stations and ITN News with Mary Nightingale.

# Dick Moore student wellbeing talks

In conjunction with the Parents Talk, Dick will be spending the entire day of Friday 1 March at school, delivering a series of specially tailored presentations to all students in the Senior School and Sixth Form. The Years 7 & 8 will have a one hour session in the morning, followed by a separate talk for the Years 9 & 10. He will then break for lunch with our Pastoral Team and Heads of Years before finishing the school day with a 90 minute talk to the Years 11, 12 and 13. We know from experience that these talks have been most beneficial to the girls and we are truly excited to be offering his wisdom and advice once again!

# Exeter University Law student workshops

We have really enjoyed hosting the Exeter University Law students, who have run a series of three lunchtime workshops for students who are either interested in a career as a lawyer or just in finding out more about the laws of this country. The workshops have been both inspiring and educational. We have





covered why we have laws, scenarios that have tested our understanding of the law, learnt new legal terminology, thought in depth about the problems linked to cyber law, found out how to apply for a law degree and the difference between manslaughter and murder!

We have really enjoyed the sessions and are most grateful for the time and effort put in by the Exeter law students to make them so successful.

They will also be running a Mock Trial on 26 February 2019 to which all students from Lower 5 through to the Sixth Form are invited. Come along and find out about what it would be like to be a barrister questioning witnesses, examining evidence and delivering a verdict. The Mock Trial begins at 4.15pm, straight after school and will run until approximately 5.45pm.

# A-level Art trip to London

At what felt like the crack of dawn on a chilly Saturday morning the Lower 6 and Upper 6 Art students assembled at the train station. Despite the hour, they were unremittingly bright eyed and bushy tailed, eager to experience the cultural feast that lay ahead.

On arrival the girls explored the Tate Modern, the Upper 6 looking for exam inspiration whilst the Lower 6 were seeking insights and stimulation for coursework. Everyone went to the Pierre Bonnard exhibition. Bonnard was one of the great colourists of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, imaginatively capturing the spirit of a moment and expressing it through his unique handling of colour



and innovative sense of composition. Without exception, they all found much food for thought in the paintings, and afterwards returned to the vast and disparate thought-provoking delights of the many other collections housed at the Tate Modern.

We walked back along the Southbank, soaking in the busy atmosphere, people- watching, pasta- tasting and photographing the skaters in the park. The girls were surprisingly still full of beans and didn't wilt until we were curled up on the train home, (temporarily) tired but sated.
