A note about the Mount Radford Lawn

Some of you may know that the school is no longer able to use the Mount Radford Lawn as a playing field because it is being sold for development. However, St Leonards Neighbourhood Association is petitioning heavily against planning permission so the Lawn can be kept for sports and recreational purposes which both the school and the local community would benefit from.

Currently they are planning their strategy for both objecting to any planning application and to see how they could attempt to own the land if and when planning permission is refused. One aspect of their objection will be to try to prove that the playing field is not 'surplus to requirements'. National planning policy says that playing fields will not be built on unless they are surplus to requirements.

The SLNA (St Leonards Neighbourhood Association) has produced a 'vision document' <u>SEE HERE</u> which sets out their ideas and includes a statement that the School gave them. They have also drawn up a survey <u>SEE HERE</u> to assess how the community, of which The Maynard is part of, feels about the future of the land.

Therefore, the SLNA have asked us to circulate these links to the Maynard community so that you can complete their survey. Survey responses to date have been extremely good but they want to keep building on these numbers as much as they can. The process of application, appeal and appeal again will take a long time but they feel that they need to be as prepared as the opposition.

If you could spare some time to support their cause by completing the survey, it would be very much appreciated – it takes about 3 minutes.
