She has also been a scientific advisor to the Blue Planet series as well as a recent documentary entitled 'Drowning in Plastic'.



Clare drew a select group of inquisitive girls eager to find out more about how she combines a love of food with a more scientific approach as the Global Director of Nutrition Science and Innovation at the Coca Cola Company. The girls certainly came away enlightened and inspired to follow their dreams and seek employment at similarly prestigious brands with all the benefits this involves.

As ever, teaching proved a popular topic and it was no surprise that Miss Hartopp drew such a large crowd to find out more about the profession. 
