Scholarships are awarded to top performing students. Scholars must make an outstanding contribution to the school and be good ambassadors.

Scholarships for 11+ entry into the Senior School in Upper 3 (Year 7)

11+ Scholarships are available to Internal & External Candidates for the following:

Academic	An application form is not required. Academic Scholarships are awarded based on performance in the 11+ Entrance Assessment.
Music	Please complete the 11+ Music Scholarship Application Form. Music Exhibitions are also available covering the cost of tuition fees for 10 instrumental or vocal lessons per term.

Scholarships for 13+ entry into the Senior School in Upper 4 (Year 9)

THE MAYNARD AWARDS



What are the Maynard Awards?

The Maynard Award Programme is an initiative which mirrors the strong ethos of The Maynard School – that an excellent education should be accessible to the most talented and gifted girls, regardless of household income.

We are committed to offering opportunities to girls from all sectors of the community to access all that we, as the leading independent girls' school in the South West, have to offer.

Maynard Awards will be available to girls who can demonstrate outstanding academic and/or extra-curricular achievements which would further enhance our vibrant community, exemplifying the ethos of our school.

Who can apply?

The Maynard Awards are for students joining the school at either Upper 3 (Year 7) or Lower 6 and incorporate two key elements:

- A scholarship awarded at the discretion of the Headmistress, primarily for academic ability but enhanced due to sporting, musical or creative talent. This can be up to 30%.
- A means-tested bursary, based on total family income and calculated by the Finance Office. This can account for up to a 45% reduction in fees although a family with a combined income of over £50,000 is unlikely to be considered.

There are also several full 100% Maynard Awards available to talented students in the State Sector who would like to join our Sixth Form.

If your daughter would benefit from the educational experience at the Maynard School, but your family is not in a position to cover the full fees, she may well be eligible for a Maynard Award.

How to apply

Maynard Awards are available for girls wishing to join the school in September 2020. If your daughter can demonstrate academic, sporting or creative excellence and you would like to apply for a Maynard Award, please contact our Admissions Office on 01392 355998 or admissions@maynard.co.uk.

The Application Form for the Maynard Award Programme is available online at maynard.co.uk or from our Admissions Office. This should be completed in conjunction with the Maynard School Registration Form and returned to the Admissions Office.

For entry into Upper 3 (Year 7) your daughter will then be invited to attend our Entrance Assessment morning. Her performance in this assessment will be part of the award criteria. If successful, she will then be required to attend the 11+ Scholarship & Awards Day.

Students joining the Lower 6 will be invited to one of our Sixth Form Interview evenings.

Although we have set dates each January, Entrance Assessments can be arranged all year round, and Maynard Awards can be offered throughout the year at the Headmistress' discretion, depending on availability.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL CANDIDATES

- Scholarships and Maynard Awards are offered by The Maynard School to recognise and encourage excellence.
- More information on scholarships is available on our website www.maynard.co.uk.
- Maynard Awards can be offered all year round at the discretion of the Headmistress, depending on availability.
- Applications from both internal and external candidates will be processed by the Admissions Office.
- Unless otherwise stated, scholarships are worth 10% of the full school fees.
- Maynard Awards are calculated based on ability and income and range from 30% - 75%.
- Students may only apply for one type of scholarship.
- Students can apply for a means-tested bursary of up to 45% fee remission.
- If scholarships or awards are oversubscribed, a short-listing process will be implemented.
- The School reserves the right not to award a scholarship or award if, in the opinion of the selection panel, no candidates meet the required standard.
- In Upper 3 (Year 7) and Upper 4 (Year 9) scholarships are generally awarded up to the end of the Sixth Form.
- Sixth Form scholarships are awarded for the duration of the Sixth Form.
- Scholarships and awards are reviewed annually, and scholars will be expected to participate regularly in relevant school

activities, maintaining standards of attainment and conduct to continue their scholarship in future years

- A scholarship or award may be withdrawn or reduced if, in the opinion of the Headmistress, the student's attendance, progress or behaviour no longer merits the continuation of the scholarship or award.
- The panel's decision is final, there is no appeals process.

For Sixth Form candidates:

Those receiving scholarships or awards are expected to make a real contribution to the academic life of the school as a whole, and to be a role model for younger girls. These responsibilities are intended to help the scholars or those gaining awards develop transferable skills that will be important in their future careers.

Each Sixth Form Scholar will be expected to:

- Lead one Junior assembly per term in the field of her scholarship
- Play a key role in a club in her subject for Key Stage 3 students
- Participate in Maynard Open Days
- Demonstrate a commitment to independent learning (by, for example, attending external events such as conferences or exhibitions and/or being involved with professional bodies or other outside organisations)
- Attend relevant school events
- Additionally, Art Scholars are expected to donate to the School one piece of artwork, chosen by the Art Department.
