


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## FOREWORD

Ballet with Mrs Barlow


Ballet has continued to be a big hit with Mrs Barlow, fondly known as our very own Mary Poppins.

#### **UK Mathematical Olympiad** for Girls

Congratulations to Megan and Helena (Upper 6) and to Joey (Lower 6) who all gained a distinction in the UK Mathematical Olympiad for Girls. Joey also qualified for the British Olympiad follow-on round as one of only a thousand students out of over 10,000 entries.

Isa (Upper 6), Maya and India (Lower 6) also gained merits and, in total, almost 75% of our Sixth Form mathematicians were awarded a certificate. Superb results!



#### 'Secret Me' winners announced

There was much scratching of heads as our judges battled to separate the entries in our 'Secret Me' art competition for Upper 3 to Upper 4!

It really was the toughest of tasks but, when push came to shove, they all unanimously agreed that Molly's quirky and creative depiction of her alter ego was the stand-out champion!



Dr Michelle Bailey and Almudena Visser Velez, who are co-leaders of the Exeter University Women in Physics network, visited the school in November to deliver a presentation to our GCSE and A-level students. The aim of the presentation was to encourage more young women to study Physics, promote careers in Science and highlight the merits of studying Science subjects at university. Dr Michelle Bailey spoke about her role within the Women in Physics network and the Institute of Physics as well as her work as a research fellow in Biophysics. Almudena Visser Velez then spoke about her educational journey from school to becoming a final Year



#### **UK Space Design Competition**

On Saturday 25th November, Darcey, Jesse, Konnie and Grace (from the Upper 6) and Izzie, Nandipa and Victoria (from the Lower 6) participated in the regional round of the UK Space Design Competition at Exeter University. The students worked in a team with two other students to design and cost a 'maintenance facility for repairing mining equipment on the dark side of the Moon' and then presented their pitch to a group of judges. The Maynard students did incredibly well, collaborating with other students and utilising their Physics and Maths skills. In a field of highly prestigious schools, from as far afield as South Wales, our students finished in second place overall, narrowly missing out on a place at the National Finals at Imperial College. We are very proud of their achievement.

Also, some of these students also attended our Sixth Form Physics trip to the Norman Lockyer Observatory a couple of night earlier to do some stargazing. Two Physics trips in one week - go Maynard!

#### Lower 4 trip to Buckland Abbey

The Lower 4s were treated to a very festive visit to Buckland Abbey, the former home of Sir Francis Drake. They learned all about how the Tudors celebrated Christmas as well as, of course, key facts about Drake himself and his circumnavigation of the globe.

All snowflakes contain six sides or points owing to the way in which they form. The molecules on ice crystals join to one another in a hexagonal structure, an arrangement which allows water molecules – each with one oxygen and two hydrogen atoms – to form together in the most efficient way.



#### Top scoring Sparx mathematicians

Congratulations to this term's top Sparx scorers who were awarded their certificates in an assembly at the end of term. Some of their results have been absolutely staggering and many have outperformed the national average by enormous margins! Tigs in Upper 4 has completely blown us away, scoring 14,951 points to win the 'Best in School' title for the term - a very, very well done to her and to everyone else for such solid performances!
