The Year 4s kicked the new year off in great style with the most fabulous Double Elephant Print Workshop with artist, Simon Ripley. Working in a real-life artist's studio was an absolute highlight and the girls had a go at several different styles of printing, making monoprints and collagraphs on the theme of animals in their habitats.









Being particles!

Year 4 have been learning about solids, liquids and gases and how the particles in each of these behave. We played 'Act out the Particles' and took it in turns to call out each of the states of matter while the rest of the class acted them out. For example, a solid is made up of low energy particles in a close, fixed structure. To show this, the girls all joined tightly together and jiggled a little on the spot. The particles in a liquid are close together but not tightly packed and have higher energy, so they move past each other easily. At this command, the girls are able to walk past each other slowly and a little further away from each other. A gas is made up of particles with lots of energy; they are constantly zooming around and have space between them. The girls pretended to be a gas by running around freely in the room.

The girls absolutely loved this opportunity to express themselves as a particle and certainly remembered all the facts by the end of the lesson!

Geography Hazards Workshop

Our Upper 4 Geographers adopted roles in humanitarian aid, search and rescue, military and medical aid in a fascinating disaster relief mapping workshop, led by the British Cartographic Society in January.

In the two-hour 'Restless Earth' workshop, they learned about the Japanese earthquake, tsunami and nuclear disaster of 2011, and were tasked to mimic organisations like the UN in producing maps to support the aid workers. The girls rose to the challenge with customary gusto to produce both largeand small-scale maps just like those that would have been used to save lives in real life disasters. These included minute

details such as the extent of tsunami damage, the nuclear exclusion zone, areas for shelter, transport networks and more.







The National Apprenticeship Show

In February, we took a group of our senior students in Upper 5 and the Sixth Form to the National Apprenticeship Show at Sandy Park, providing them with an exciting opportunity to investigate different career paths and explore apprenticeship opportunities.





Model United Nations

In January, we attended the Bristol Grammar School Model United Nations Conference. There were over 220 students in attendance, grappling this time with historical issues, from the Suez Canal crisis to the transition of Zimbabwe from Rhodesia.

The girls performed splendidly as the delegations from Israel and Pakistan, with Poppy receiving an award in her committee, whilst India, Hannah and Willow also successfully passed their resolution clauses in the General Assembly. They can all be proud of their efforts!

Senegal Pen Pals

We were so thrilled that 35 of our girls from Upper 3 through to Upper 5 have taken the fantastic opportunity to be paired with a Senegalese pen pal as part of their French studies, not only developing their language skills outside the classroom but also widening their cultural knowledge of another French-speaking country.

This fabulous programme is organised by Mme Smith alongside Katie, an old Maynardian, who has been in Senegal on her gap year and working as an English teacher in College de Yene.

Friday lunchtimes have been buzzing in the French classroom with girls dropping into the "Write To My Penpal" club when they need a little help with ideas, French expressions and vocab. It's always such an exciting time when new letters come in - long may their friendships last!



Inter House Escape Room Challenge

All houses split into small groups with members across the ages from Upper 3 through to Upper 6, and worked together to Escape from Wonderland... They collaboratively solved conundrums from the caterpillar, puzzled out chess challenges from the Cheshire Cat, and painted the roses red before the queen yelled "off with her head"!

Congratulations to the team from Armourers who completed the challenge with 12 minutes remaining, with two teams from Merchants not far behind, and a very well done to everyone who escaped!

Fabulous Faraday Challenge

A team of superstar Lower 4 (Year 8) girls put their skills to the test back in January for the IET Faraday Challenge Day, facing off against teams from other local schools to create a solution to a real-world problem.

We were very happy to host the challenge in the Performing Arts Centre, where eager students spent the day in a whirlwind of activity, including selecting their team roles, completing an engineering task, appropriately budgeting and acquiring materials they needed from the 'shop' led by staff, and producing a fabulous product which they then presented to the rest of the attendees. It was a fantastic opportunity to integrate Science, Design, Mathematics, Engineering and more.

The final products generated were all excellent and showed wonderful innovation, with real potential to have a wider positive impact – a huge well done to everyone who took part!



Brian Cox lecture

Earlier in the term, our Upper 6 physicists popped down the road to Torquay's Princess Theatre for a mind-blowing talk from Professor Brian Cox on the history of cosmology, the evolution of the universe and the beginning and end of time.

BPhO British Physics Olympiad

British Physics Olympiad

We were thrilled to learn that Grace was awarded a Bronze level 2 award, whilst Konnie and Matilda both achieved Bronze level 1 awards, in the notoriously challenging Year 13 British Physics Olympiad competition.

In the words of Robin Hughes, organiser of the competition, "University professors have taken this at school and 'got nowhere'. Every question requires a different perspective to get the measure of it. This fluency in recognising topics and linking ideas is, in part, what develops the physicist's confidence and mastery. It takes time and perseverance to master this challenge."

We are incredibly proud of our Upper 6s' motivation and perseverance, as well as the stunning progress that they have made in their Physics since the start of their A-level studies. Grace's outstanding mark puts her in the top half of the 3000 candidates who took the paper, with these candidates all likely to be the very best Physics students in their school.

British Biology Olympiad

Our top Biology students took part in the annual British Biology Olympiad this February and congratulations to all of them!

Matilda and Megan stormed straight through to a gold award – reserved for the top 5% nationally of over 13,000 entries. Other marvellous results include Fiona and Helena's silver awards, Maddy's bronze award, and Megan L's ranking as highly commended.

Further to the above, we are super proud to share that Megan has subsequently been selected for the next round of the process to gain a place on the British team for the International Biology Olympiad. As such, she will be travelling to the University of Warwick in April to spend a weekend participating in a range of further challenges and, if successful, she will be heading to Kazakhstan in July!





Senior Physics Challenge

Not to be outdone by the year above, our Lower 6 girls enjoyed outstanding successes in the Senior Physics Challenge and every student who entered received an award. Not to mention that 40% of the Maynard entries were Gold, compared to 18% overall.

Highlights include Joey and Vratny's Gold Awards - in which Joey was in the top 100 of 6000 total students - plus Maya and Victoria's Silver Awards and Nandipa's Bronze Award.

Only 27.4% of total entries were from girls, so there is clearly still a gender gap in students studying Physics and we're so proud of our girls for not being daunted by this!



Our first musical extravaganza of 2024 featured 16 young musicians performing in a Teatime Concert in the Main School Hall on Thursday 1st February. With a tango, a hornpipe, some Dolly Parton and Maroon 5, traditional folk music, film music, works by local composers and an abridged version of John Cage's 4'33, it was certainly a highly varied programme!
