Students will also discover why people work and the different ways of working. These will be learnt through an interactive higher/lower quiz, through group discussion and individual reflection

7 & 8	Jobs In a Zoo	1, 2	Students are introduced to a zoo through a short video. Using group work, students are encouraged to consider the job roles involved in a zoo. This discussion leads to grouping the roles into job families and helping students see the similarities between the roles in the same job families. They research in depth, using Morrisby Online Careers data base three jobs they are interested in.
